

Sunday Troparion

(Tone 4) When the women disciples of the Lord learned from the angel the joyous message of Your Resurrection, they cast away the ancestral curse and with gladness told the apostles; Death is overthrown. Christ God is risen, granting the world great mercy.

Troparion of the Venerable Father

(Tone 4) O long-suffering forefather, you acquired patient endurance emulating the asceticism of the Baptism, and shared in the divine zeal of both, you were worthy to receive their names as a fearless preacher of the true Faith. You led a multitude of monks to Christ, and confirmed all the people in Orthodoxy. O Job our venerable father, pray that our souls be saved.

Sunday Kondakion

(Tone 4) My Saviour and Redeemer arose from the tomb as God and delivered the earthborn from bondage. He has shattered the gates of Hades and as Master, He has risen on the third day.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

Kondakion of the Venerable Father

(Tone 4) You became a pillar of the true Faith, a zealot of the commandments of the Gospel, the reproof of pride, and an intercessor and instructor for the lowly. Therefore, beg for forgiveness of sins for those who honour you, and preserve

from harm your monastery, O Job our father, you are like the long-suffering one of old.

Both now, and ever, and unto the ages of ages. Amen.

Theotokion

(Tone 6) O Protection of Christians that cannot be put to shame, / unchanging mediation unto the Creator, / do not despise the suppliant voices of sinners, / but be quick to come to our aid, O Good One, / who in faith cry out to You: / hasten to intercession and come quickly to make supplication, / for You, O Theotokos, always protect those who honour You.

Prokeimenon

Reader: (Tone 4) How marvelous are Your works, O Lord. In wisdom You have made them all.

Verse: Bless the Lord, O my soul. O Lord my God, You are very great.

Reader: A 2nd Prokimen in the 7th tone, Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of His Saints.

Epistle

(Galations 2:16-20) – Brethren: Knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the law but by faith in Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Christ Jesus, that we might be justified by faith in Christ and not by the works of the law;

for by the works of the law no flesh shall be justified. But if, while we seek to be justified by Christ, we ourselves also are found sinners, is Christ therefore a minister of sin? Certainly not! For if I build again those things which I destroyed, I make myself a transgressor. For I through the law died to the law that I might live to God. I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me.

Alleluia Verses

Reader: (Tone 4) Bend your bow and proceed prosperously, and be king because of truth, meekness, and righteousness. Alleluia.

Verse 1: You have loved righteousness and hated iniquity. Alleluia.

Verse 2: Another Alleluia in Tone 6: Blessed is the man who fears the Lord, who greatly delights in His commandments. Alleluia.

Gospel

(Luke 8:26-39) – Let us be attentive. Then they sailed to the country of the Gadarenes, which is opposite Galilee. And when He stepped out on the land, there met Him a certain man from the city who had demons for a long time. And he wore no clothes, nor did he live in a house but in the tombs. When he saw Jesus, he cried out, fell down before Him, and

with a loud voice said, "What have I to do with You, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg You, do not torment me!" For He had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. For it had often seized him, and he was kept under guard, bound with chains and shackles; and he broke the bonds and was driven by the demon into the wilderness. Jesus asked him, saying, "What is your name?" And he said, "Legion," because many demons had entered him. And they begged Him that He would not command them to go out into the abyss. Now a herd of many swine was feeding there on the mountain. So they begged Him that He would permit them to enter them. And He permitted them. Then the demons went out of the man and entered the swine, and the herd ran violently down the steep place into the lake and drowned. When those who fed them saw what had happened, they fled and told it in the city and in the country. Then they went out to see what had happened, and came to Jesus, and found the man from whom the demons had departed, sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed and in his right mind. And they were afraid. They also who had seen it told them by what means he who had been demon-possessed was healed. Then the whole multitude of the surrounding region of the Gadarenes asked Him to depart from them, for they were seized with great fear. And He got into the boat and returned. Now the man from whom the demons had departed begged Him that he might be with Him. But Jesus sent him away, saying, "Return to your own house, and tell what great things God has done for you." And he went his way and proclaimed throughout the whole city what great things Jesus had done for him.

A note regarding Holy Communion

The Holy Orthodox Church understands Communion to mean that we have all things in common, sharing an identical Faith, and only those who are members of the Orthodox Church and who have prepared themselves through prayer, fasting and recent confession may participate in Holy Communion. WHAT RENOVATIONS WERE DONE TO THE CHURCH MANSE?

New waterlines: Removed of all Poly-B piping in walls, floors, ceilings (faulty). Re-pipe all water lines with pex piping.

- installed a humidifier.

New Flooring: carpet and underlay (upstairs), laminate planks (main floor), and partial new subfloor.

Kitchen: back splash, sink, faucet, new arborite counter top, Stainless appliances (fridge, oven, dishwasher, range hood)

Bathrooms: linoleum, new lighting, new toilets (3), New tiled shower in master bedroom ensuite and shower floor.

Painting and window coverings:

- Painted all walls, ceilings, doors, baseboards and trims.
- New grabber pleated window coverings for all windows

Outside: replaced deck and railings, added a garden shed, new window wells, new non-freeze hose-bibs for outside taps, replaced exterior lights and new locks on all doors.
